In November, Go Red Goes STEM will bring together 75 female high school students across the Chicago area to teach them a variety of STEM-related topics as well as professional development and mentoring discussions.

Go Red History: The Go Red for Women campaign has been funding research and contributing to developments in care for women with heart disease for years. In 2004, 70,000 more women than men were dying of heart disease on an annual basis and today, 5,000 less are losing their lives to heart disease. The premise of this campaign started with

the recognition that women have different symptoms of heart disease than men, and also require different treatment plans, distinctions that were not previously taken into consideration. Go Red for Women is now leveraging this campaign to encourage more women to enter the STEM fields and ultimately contribute to continued research and developments in the areas of STEM.
